From the Pastor's Pen

An Unconventional, But Deeply Traditional, Advent Challenge

I could not help noticing the other day, when during announcements I said, "Christmas is about a month away," that there was a wave through the sanctuary of what sounded like ... sighs and groans! I know: It was not how you felt about Christmas, but it was rather a reaction to how fast time went. Plus, you wanted to humor your pastor. Nonetheless, we do know that Christmas is often a busy season. There are a few things we need to do in preparation, as long as we celebrate that special occasion.

I have made a commitment in hopes to make the most of this season, and that is to set certain times throughout the day for a brief prayer. This will continue until December 31. I would love for you to give it a try, too.

I was inspired from multiple sources.
Back in early fall, Seonyoung Kim,
our District Superintendent, shared that she
had been praying the Lord's Prayer five times
a day—at 9 in the morning, noon, 3, 6, and 9;
and that it made such a difference that she
wanted to share it with the fellow clergy. She
also shared it at our charge conference, and I
know one person who has taken up the
challenge. Incidentally, this person had also
been inspired by a book, 21 Seconds to
Change Your World by Mark Rutland, a similar
idea.

I also came across a talk given by the author

and pastor Rick Warren. Speaking on the subject of Daniel in the Bible, he has challenged his church to a "34 days of seeking God," or, a daily "three-time conversations with God" for the last 34 days of this year. It was not the discipline aspect that necessarily inspired me, but the challenge to seek God. I agree with Warren that no search yields greater rewards than that of seeking God. As Warren put it, "What are you really, really looking for in life ... and is it worth spending 34 days at the end of this year [in] seeking God to get you ready for the next year?" Spending as little as ten minutes a day, 3-4 minutes of being alone with God each time?

Biblically, even just a word uttered in sigh can be a prayer. But a genuine relationship is built upon regular, honest, and sometimes even scheduled, conversations. Just because God knows our hearts does not mean that we do not need to intentionally seek God. To the contrary, it is because God so graciously seeks us that we seek him; it is because God is a personal being that we adopt spiritual disciplines—otherwise we would merely "have the form of godliness but deny its power." (2 Tim. 3:5) Jesus said that some miracles happen only through prayer and fasting (Mt. 17:21).

When you have a conversation with God three times a day in the name of Jesus, you could not help feeding on your relationship with God; and see what Christmas means to you when it arrives.

Warren also had a few reminders that are not often heard these days. Pray with emotions (that is what real conversations look like).

Show to God that you are serious (in other words, go further than forcing God to ask, 'Is this a whim, a wish, or a prayer?'); fasting is one way to show God that you are serious about what you are asking. Make a humble confession (Say, 'God, I blew it,' if it needs to be said).

Won't you join me in taking up this particular challenge? Anyone can pray the Lord's Prayer, and then afterwards, surely we all have some things to say to God. I look forward to swapping some stories with you on how it all went down.

In the past we supported two to three missionaries. Looking ahead to the budget for 2018, this committee has been made aware of a devote missionary in Cambodia, Clara Biswas. She is a teacher in the Christian Student Movement. 
