

# From the Pastor's Pen... Remember the Lord Your God

Deuteronomy 8:12-18 -12 When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them, 13 and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied, 14 then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, 15 who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock, 16 and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good. 17 Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth." 18 But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today.

Here is the background to this passage. The LORD God had led the children of Israel out of Egypt with a grand display of divine might. The people witnessed the parting of the Red Sea and crossed through it on dry ground. They experienced the cloud of God's presence that shielded them from the desert sun by day and a pillar of fire that kept them warm at night. When they were hungry, Yahweh provided daily bread — manna – from heaven. When they were thirsty, water miraculously poured forth from a rock. When the people wanted meat, God sent them quails to satisfy their appetites.

There were many threats and rebellions along the journey to the Promised Land, but they were almost there. Moses is nearing the end of his ministry and is trying to prepare the people for crossing the Jordan into their new homeland, and he warns the people to "remember the Lord your God." (Hmmm. He knew those folks pretty well, didn't he?!)

In the wilderness, the people were always afraid of scarcity; they were fearful of not having enough, so they were always crying out to Moses and God to provide for them. But in the Promised Land, they will experience prosperity as they have never

known before, and that has risks, too. When times are tough, people at least think about God and look to God for their needs. However, when times are really good, people usually take credit for their success and spend less time thinking about God.

Times have changed, but human nature remains the same. We, too, have trouble with material blessings! We want them, to be sure, but once we receive them, we tend to forget our utter dependence upon the living God. The things we possess make us think we are self-sufficient and independent. Nevertheless, it is the Lord who enables us to prosper in life, and he longs to be remembered and to be in relationship with us, his children.




The season of Lent invites us to examine the depth of our relationship with God and to embrace a more simple way of life – one that remembers God fully. May the Lord search our hearts and

#### Stations of the Cross

This year for Good Friday (April 18), the church will be open from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm for Stations of the Cross. You will enter the church through the fellowship hall. Starting in the fellowship hall and going into the sanctuary, there will be 8 stations set up - you will begin at Station1 and walk your way through to Station 8. After you have visited all 8 stations, you are asked to quietly leave the church.

Saint Francis of Assisi is said to have begun this way of devotional time with 14 stops or stations along the path. Our journey will include 8 stations that are specifically identified in Scripture. You will walk with Jesus from when He is condemned to death to when He is laid in the tomb. We invite you to come and spend some time in prayer and to reflect on the Scripture at each station. A booklet will be provided that is yours to keep - it has space for you to write down your thoughts as you read and meditate.

#### **United Methodist Women**

On March 10, Central UMW hosted JoAnn Wilson-Harfst, Director of Mathews County Department of Social Services. Her topic was The Face of Poverty in Mathews County. The number of persons receiving aid in the county is 888 - 18% of those are children. Mrs. Wilson-Harfst explained that the county receives more than \$11 million for aid for these families, of which over \$400,000 are contributed from members of the community. She described the influences of the economy and the rural location of Mathews on residents in the county. It was a very interesting and informative program.

On March 30 after the joint church service, the UMW will offer a potato bar in the fellowship hall. All are welcome to participate in this program as a Lenten observance.

Our April 14 program will be *Prayer and Self Denial* led by Christine Ulrich. It begins at 7:00 pm in the fellowship hall. All are welcome.
