From the Administrative Council Chair

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church is the overarching, governing body of the United Methodist Church. This conference is meeting in North Carolina April 23 through May 3, 2024. This is the conference group that was supposed to meet in 2020 but didn't because of Covid.

The United Methodist Church General Conference is the only body that can set official policy and speak for the international denomination. Think of the two-week gathering as a combination of a United Nations General Assembly, a U.S. congressional session and a time of rousing Christian worship. <u>Read More</u>

Our church has no one designated to attend the General Conference. We will be represented by the people named in the list of delegates from the Virginia conference who were voted on at the 2018 annual conference. These individuals are also found in the link above. The results of the actions of the General Conference will determine the way the United Methodist Church does business, approaches worship, and supports missions in the future. They will pass legislation during the upcoming meeting which outlines this. This information will eventually come to the Virginia Conference (the conference we are part of) to implement.

Rev. Rebecca has given information about some of the issues to be addressed by the General Conference, and the Administrative Council will try to provide additional information about the General Conference progress as it occurs. Check out the link that says, "read more".

We will use the Chimes and the Weekly News to provide more information. Also, on April 14,

2024, at 2:00 pm, at St. Luke's UMC, in Yorktown, Warren Harper, Virginia delegate to the General Conference, will be giving information on the topics being discussed during conference.


Vision of United Methodist Women

He has made everything beautiful in its time.—Ecclesiastes 3:11

Lately, the weather has been warming up. Flowers and trees are starting to bloom. My yard already needs to be mowed. Spring is setting in. But it's early. I can remember snow in March, and even April. I can remember still having to bundle up because it was cold. I can remember a time when the heat ran regularly due to the temperatures and we were not opening windows or turning fans on. But it's different now. The seasons are changing earlier. The cold weather is not hanging around guite so long. My children have not had the chance to experience snow like I did when I was young. Snows where we were out of school for several days and could build snowmen, have snowball fights, go sledding, and make snow angels. Things have changed. And I don't particularly like it.
