

#### **Finance**

We are half way through the year and we are doing much better than last year. General budget offering is up around 10% compared to 2015 and the previous four year average. General offering at the end of June was \$82,343, while general expenses were \$79,549. This does not include unusual expenses for new heat pumps for the Sanctuary and a new computer purchased for the office. We have existing funds to cover these. Thank you Central for your continued stewardship.

Some of you may wonder how your contributions are processed, so I would like to say a few words about that. Each Sunday after the 11:00 service, our Financial Secretary, Marcia Fry, and two volunteers gather all the collections for counting. Each and every contribution, whether check, cash, or coin is sorted and entered by computer into our record system. It is carefully cross checked for accuracy as to the amount, contributor, and whether it is for general, designated, or some other requested application. We use a very good software system, PowerChurch, to facilitate this process. All of this is carried out in the spirit of trust and confidentiality. It usually takes less than one hour to finish this task. There are 52 Sundays, so it is asking a lot for this to fall on the shoulders of a few volunteers, and even more for Marcia. You are invited to help us out, even just a few times, or if you live nearby, be a substitute when needed on short notice. No experience necessary.

#### **Trustees**

There are four initiatives in the Trustees efforts for July / August actions.

First, one of our two central air conditioners failed that cool the Sanctuary. As we looked at the options, we determined it would be prudent to replace both units as they were installed at the same time (1998). A big "Thank You" to Gerald Taylor for replacing both with heat pumps and he installed the units the weekend of July 4th at a price that was well below other bidders! These heat pumps are significantly more efficient than the old units and will also heat the Sanctuary during above freezing Sundays saving us expensive fuel oil!

Second is the Carillon system replacement.



After much effort and "trial and error" testing, we have decided what units to install and they will be dedicated at the end of the month. We are looking for volunteers to learn how our Carillon system works and to

develop the best way to use all the many capabilities - if you are interested, please contact a Trustee!

Third is the etched glass project for the three interior sanctuary doors. The designs have been finalized and Art Miller is now in possession of the designs. He will order glass, make the necessary templates to aid in etching and then we will install them in the doors. At this time, Art has not provided a completion estimate (busy man).

Fourth, there are issues with the floor structure in the Sanctuary and we are in the process of finding skilled workers that can institute repairs at a reasonable price - more in the September Central Chimes.


