Christian and Meditation



"... you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her." (Luke 10:41-42)

While I am no expert on meditation, our sessions of Oases of the Spirit have recently made me pause and reflect on the topic. Generally speaking, we are very good at things requiring us to use our head: Gathering and analyzing information, speaking and communicating out loud, organizing tasks,

charting the course of action.

Those are vital skills and activities. What is the value, then, of "lingering" on a thought in silence? For us Christians, when we so delay in the Scripture, it allows us to respond with our hearts in worship. It is Mary's posture in Luke 10. While her sister is properly busy as hostess, she sits and listens to Jesus!

I'd like to think that we each have an internal 'battery' that charges our life—our judgments, our courage, our joy, our faith, hope, and love. This battery is not charged by mere knowledge, beauty or action alone. It is filled by none other than God himself, who is Spirit. The proper way to receive God, is with the worship of our heart. "Be still and know that I am God." (Ps. 46:10)

Therefore when we worship, we receive life itself, and it is the Spirit-led acts that build a fruitful life. "... but their delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law they meditate day and night. They are like trees planted by streams of water ..." (Psalm 1:2-3)

Let's take time this summer to linger in silence over the Word of God, in prayer and worship. It is simply the stuff of life.

This verse has been a source of encouragement during our season of actively waiting. We like how this version uses the words "brave and courageous." It has taken both faith and courage for us to stand firm on the promises of the Lord during this time. Meanwhile, He has taught us to serve Him well in the present while preparing for the future.

We are humbled as God continues to refine us for His purpose. We are excited as we have been released to the next step on our journey!

Paraguay is the mission ahead of us. Less than 2 weeks ago, an opportunity opened for Carol to teach at Asunción Christian Academy (ACA). The school also has a furnished 3 bedroom apartment that we can rent for a nominal price. This is an answer to prayer since we sold most of our furniture and household goods before we came back to the States.

We have plane tickets to leave from Richmond, VA on August 3rd!

This is an outline of our plans:

- Return to Paraguay (August 2017 to July 2018)
- Training with a local church in church planting, forming and leading cell groups, spiritual warfare and intercession
- Obtain necessary visa documents for Spain
- Donald assist the church with a new church plant
- Carol teach in Asuncion Christian
 Academy and continue coursework online
 toward a doctorate in Christian Education
 Leadership through Regent University
- Transition time in the U.S. (July to September 2018)
- Finalize visa requirements for Spain
- Visit families, friends, and partnering churches
- Prepare for trip to Spain
- Arrive in Spain by September 2018

Your congregation continues to be very supportive and we believe that the tremendously uplifting feeling of a good deed done should be communicated, so please share this very

important letter with your congregation so that they may be assured that Matthew 25:40 is alive and well in Mathews!

We continue to feed more than 100 families each week through our food distribution program on Wednesdays as well as offer a good selection of gently used clothing on Thursdays. During the last two months we also have been able to....

- Assist a person on disability to pay her power bill. Her medication takes most of her funds.
- Help a young single mother working hard to improve her situation by going to nursing school who, struggling to make ends meet had no funds to fix a leaking roof in her trailer.
- Another on disability with limited funds needed help to meet her mortgage payment after she used all of her available money to pay personal property taxes.
- We made a mortgage payment for another who, due to neck surgery will be out of work until August and receives no sick pay.

These are just a few of the things we've been able to do these last several weeks, and we wanted you to know!

Very soon, I will be sharing information about an up-coming concert in October that you won't want to miss. Our community is blessed to have some extraordinary talent in our midst, and a musical presentation with the sole purpose of bringing attention to the good work that Hands Across Mathews offers the disadvantaged in our community is in the works. More to come...


