## December Mission Highlight

After praying about our final mission focus of the year, the Mission and Evangelism team decided on the Gloucester- Mathews Care Clinic.

The Gloucester-Mathews Care Clinic is committed to providing community based healthcare coverage for residents of Gloucester and Mathew Counties as well as select surrounding areas who lack health insurance or who are covered by Medicaid. This is accomplished through the efforts of volunteers, paid professional and support staff, and contributions from community members who share common values and concerns. The Clinic ensures that everyone from our counties have access to basic healthcare, including medical, dental, pharmaceutical, and educational services.

During the past year, the Clinic served over 600 patients and provided over 10,000 prescriptions. Physicians, nursing, interns and other volunteers donated 7287 hours to the Clinic and patients.

Millions of Americans wrap, ship and unwrap presents in the month of December. We generate about 25 percent more waste than usual during the holidays, according to the EPA, equating to an extra 1 million tons of waste in landfills per week.


