Add to that fellow pilgrims who are walking on the Way of Jesus with you, and we have something better than money can buy. Thanks be to God "who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world ..." (Eph. 1:3-4)

TOWARDS A MEANINGFUL LENT

Easter comes early this year on Mar. 27. There are various ways people observe Lent, but the aim is the same: To fully receive the gift of Easter. In Philippians 3:10-11 Paul writes:

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

I like how the Rev. Penny Ford put it:

Are you searching for something more? Tired of running in circles, but not really living life with direction, purpose or passion? It's pretty easy to get caught up in the drama of classes, relationships, family, and work. Our lives are filled with distractions that take us away from living a life with Christ. We try to fill the emptiness inside us with mindless TV, meaningless chatter, stimulants, alcohol, too many activities or other irrelevant stuff. We run away from life and from God.

Lent is a great time to "repent"—to return to God and re-focus our lives to be more in line with Jesus. It's a 40 day trial run in changing your lifestyle and letting God change your heart. (upperroom.org/lent101)

There are many suggestions as to how to 'practice' Lent. But an authentic journey of repentance begins with listening to the Holy Spirit—that inner voice of truth from God. Many of us know, when looking into our heart, what we need to do in order to draw near to God. If not, we should pray for discernment from the Spirit.

When Jesus met with the rich young ruler searching for eternal life, he said, "Sell your possessions and give them to the poor. Then come, follow me." I do not believe that Jesus was giving a general instruction here on benevolence. Instead he saw through the young man's heart and diagnosed an undue love of money that was holding him back. He then gave a prescription tailor-made for him, inviting at the same time for him to take hold of the true riches in God. Likewise, whatever that might slow us down, or even hold us back, from loving God wholeheartedly, is the subject of our true repentance, the kind that leads to true life through the grace of Christ.

Repentance can take the form of laying down, but also of taking up. Remember John the Baptist said, "Bear fruits that are worthy of repentance." "Forty days is a good amount of time to establish an affirmative habit." One thing I'd like for you to pray about, is visiting a Sunday school during this year's Lent, if you are not a part of one. I have seen how being a part of a smaller community can make a big difference, and our classes will be more than glad to have you.

Trustees

Your Board of Trustees has worked steadily through the past year and would like to mention just a few completed tasks. Programmable thermostats were installed in the social hall and sanctuary as an energy saving measure. The parsonage received a good cleaning and numerous necessary repairs were made prior to the arrival of Pastor John. New vents were installed around the church foundation. Stained glass windows in the sanctuary were repaired. Several policies and procedures were reviewed in an effort to keep our church operating in a safe and sustainable manner. The beautiful new doors on the front of the church were designed and installed, thanks to your generous contributions in memory of Ron Duff.

Plans for the coming year include structural repairs to the pulpit floor, rewiring of the sanctuary sound system, and installation of new carpet throughout the sanctuary. Funds are available for this project and the work will begin soon. We will consider steps that may be taken to make the church more easily accessible. Plans are also underway to design and install etched glass window panels for the inner doors to the sanctuary.

Your input is always welcome and we would specifically like to hear from the congregation concerning replacement (or repair, if feasible) of the carillon chimes. Our best guess is that this project would cost around \$5,000, and will only go forward if we hear that you support it.
