From the Pastor's Pen

.....

"Diversity and Maturity"

I grew up in one of the world's most homogenous country. Ninety-nine percent of the people in my country were Koreans; they had the same dark hair, the same brown eyes; we all spoke the same

language. Naturally, there was a strong sense of ethnic identity, and we were quite

of ethnic identity, and we were quite proud to be who we were. When I came to America, however, I saw the racial and cultural diversity that exist here. It was part of people's daily life. It was part of the fabric of the society. People looked different to begin with—something I used to take for granted to be largely the same.

At first I thought, "What confusion this must be!" But over time I came to see the maturity that results from diversity. Thanks to our differences, we have learned to recoanize the value of our common humanity. We have learned, for example, that beauty goes deeper than looks. Fair skin and blonde hair are often cited as attractive traits, but we know nonetheless that true beauty is found elsewhere, having lived with people of different looks. We cheer for team USA hard, but not as if the nation might rise and fall by the scores; we know that we have come from different places. We prize our heritages, but we insist on the greater things that establish our shared life: the rule of law, justice, fairness, compassion, and the Word of God.

Central has two worship services on most Sundays, and there is a degree of difference between the 8:30 service and the 11:00



service. The early service has a 'breakfast crowd at Hardee's' feel. The atmosphere is somewhat relaxed, but it being at early morning, and with the older crowd, there is a touch of calm and serenity, too. Coffee naturally follows the service. At the later service the choir sings, the organ plays, and often there is a bunch of children and youths. The preacher often wears a robe, as

do the choir. It is a mixture of casually dressed youngsters and refined-looking adults.

Some have said that the two services can look like two different communities. More than anything it perhaps speaks to the strength of a worshipping community: You are bound to feel closer to people with whom you worship regularly. Plus, if

you look closely, there are places where the people come together—Sundays schools, Bible studies, UMM and UMW, and even committee meetings.

I thought about how Central has been blessed with two services, and it occurs to me that such diversity may well be a gift. You may enjoy the early morning calm of the 8:30 service, but in the same church, there are children and youths who worship with you; and you have an opportunity to serve them. You may have deep roots to the community, but in the same church you also get to be with those from up North or big cities who recently begun a new life here in Mathews. We may value quiet serenity of Mathews life above all, but you may be challenged by those who have a heart for Christ's mission in the wider world.
