From the Pastor's Pen

"While physical training is of some value, godliness is valuable in every way, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come." (1 Tim. 4:8)

On Christmas evening I drove myself to the emergency room with a severe pain in my side for what eventually turned out to be a case of kidney stone. In retrospect there are worse troubles to be had, but the pain, the morphine, and the prospect of more to come all loomed large in my mind as I lay on the hospital bed. For the first time I felt as if my body had let me down, and the anxiety and (surprisingly) loneliness that came with it were unsettling, albeit soothed by a gratitude for the care I received.

It occurred to me that many people I knew dealt with much, much more grave circumstances. The unfairness of sickness was an ordinary human experience. I also did think about Christ. Other things aside, how did he endure the stress of knowing all that was ahead? More to the point, why did he have to? Unexpectedly, however, I found it easier to pray during that week than ever before. My personal sense of security had taken a blow, but my prayers took on a flight. I did pray for healing, but I found myself mostly seeking God himself.

Oddly enough, we seem to grow closer to God in our weakness. I wish that was not the case, and I wish Christ had not had to suffer. But as riddled as we humans are with pride and self-centeredness, we often see God's face when we are humbled. Jesus said, "Do not worry about tomorrow ... Your Heavenly Father knows what you need before you ask

him"; but he also said, "Whoever would come after me, let them deny themselves, take up their own cross daily and follow me." (Lk. 9:23) That may be why many have cherished disciplines such as fasting and silence; they found themselves nearer to God.



Committing to spiritual disciplines such as prayer, fasting, self-examination (journaling), acts of kindness, group study, etc. is a form of self-denial. The same

goes with listening to the Holy Spirit for everyday obedience. But we do it for love's sake. We choose them not to make God hear and meet us, but for us to hear and meet him better.
