#### From the Pastor's Pen

"Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you." (My. 6:33)

In July you will begin seeing some works done around the fellowship hall. The trustees have worked on a plan to renovate and update the looks of the fellowship hall, ever since it became clear that the floor needed to be replaced early this year. This includes works on floor, painting, and lightings. Multiple bids were sought, as well as professional opinions.

As you see the works being done, I would like for us to know and remember several things. First, I appreciate the integrity and unity that the trustees displayed throughout the decision process. The members were united from day one to do what they thought was the best for the room and for the church.

Secondly, not everyone is going to be completely happy with the changes coming to our beloved space, and that is normal for the life of the church. What is also ordinary for church, is that we rely on the grace of God to make all things work for the good. Let us remember that God is the one who ultimately orders our steps (Prob. 16:9), and we should put our faith in God. We humans are not perfect; God is. Let us show mercy to one another, and let us trust in God.

Thirdly, our mission as church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We renovate this room to serve its purpose - to support the church and the community's fellowship and activities - in route to following Jesus. Following Jesus is

the goal, and not just having the room we can most feel proud of.

Last but not least, the funding for this series of projects come from the bequest by the late Bailey Hudgins. In his will he specified that the gift be used for the improvement of the interior and exterior of the church building and its grounds. We should be grateful for the generosity of those who gave and the faithfulness of those who have managed and administered the gift.

I know that this sizeable gift has been in the past a source of disagreements. While we are fortunate to have no such questions this time around, now is the time more than ever to remember that the church is built not by money alone but "by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." We are grateful for every single gift regardless of the size, because the church does not sink or swim due to the availability of any single gift. If the Lord opens

the door, and if we follow the Spirit, money will be there; and if heaven closes the door, no amount of money will avail. "Not by power, not by might, but by my spirit, says the Lord." (Zech. 4:6) The important thing is to seek God's will, and we should be grateful when our resources are used for God's work. After all, we are merely stewards of God's gifts, and our rewards will come from the Lord.

I am so thankful that you support the mission of the church through your giving in so many ways. May we together make disciples of Christ, who taught us "to seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you." "I pray that your partnership with us in the faith may be effective in deepening your understanding of every good thing we share for the sake of Christ." (Philemon 1:6)
