#### From the Pastor's Pen

Central is now a Stage 2 Pioneer Church, meaning that we now resume in-person service and meetings under appropriate protocols. We held a service in the sanctuary last Sunday (Jun. 28) with fourteen people present. Everyone spread out, as pews were cordoned off, and we became used to wearing masks fairly quickly. We missed being able to sing, but all in all we had a time of worship together.

Even though we now hold services at the church, I do not necessarily ask everyone to come back to it at this point. We are not out of the woods yet with the coronavirus, and I encourage those with higher health risks to err on the side of caution. For those who do attend in person, we are abiding by protocols that promote safety. There is something special about being physically present with one another, and in-person service will continue as we look forward to the days of greater safety.

To have traveled out of state is not an automatic reason not to be allowed to attend. However, it may be wise for those who have traveled to areas where COVID is rising and have visited public places to wait a couple of weeks before attending service at the church.

We are all hoping and praying for the day when we will together sing, shake hands, and embrace one another. We are taking small steps forward. Meanwhile, let's not merely aim for returning to the former routines. What can we do today as church that serves Jesus Christ? Individually, how can you and me cultivate our walk with Jesus? Let's look for the new ways. If someone had told me six months ago that I would be putting up YouTube videos weekly I would have laughed. With God's help and a spirit of openness (and sometimes with a bit of pressure) we can do new things to serve Christ.

Please continue to pray that Central Church may be led by the Holy Spirit. It is the very best thing that we could ask for the church.

### Stage 2 Reminders (6/25/2020)

•**Register 4 days ahead.** Please call or email church office (725-2832, office@centralumcmathews.org) or pastor (384-3521)

• Complete Health Acknowledgment Form, also by Wednesday.

It can be done online (Go to *www.vaumc.org* - > Admin -> EVC -> COVID Health Acknowledgment Form. Central is in <u>York</u> <u>River District</u>) or by calling pastor (804-384-3521).

• Check temperature Sunday morning. Please stay home if feeling sick or have fever (100.4°F)

• Wear a face covering. Mask or bandana to be worn during worship and on the church premise, including during restroom visits.

• **Keep physical distance** of at least six feet, exception given to those living in the same household. Some pews will be marked off.

• Please no hugging or hand-shaking.


• **Enter by the front doors.** Exit through the door in the front of the sanctuary.

The above protocols except for the last item apply to non-worship meetings.

Dear Virginia Annual Conference:

These are certainly challenging times – and there is also a great deal of positive news for our church. Through faith, flexibility, and hard work we are returning to inperson worship in a safe and responsible manner.

Virginia is on track to enter Phase Three of Governor Northam's reopening plan this Wednesday, July 1, 2020, as the number of COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and deaths continue to decline in the Commonwealth. The Conference has been carefully monitoring events at the state level and the transition to Phase Three by Governor Northam was expected. It does not impact our return to worship plans.

Our churches continue the return to in-person under the <u>Stage 2 criteria</u> that went into effect for the Conference on June 21, 2020. The Conference will remain in our Stage 2 for the foreseeable future as we are being rigorous about the safety of our members and guests. Face coverings and social distancing are essential at all in-person gatherings.

I encourage all churches to return to inperson worship, even if it is with a modest number of church members, while continuing to provide online or telephonic worship services. We will continue to monitor and evaluate events. As trends are expected to continue to improve in Virginia, we will likely loosen some of the requirements for in-person worship.
