Ashleigh Rose Jachles





What's new in "plastics"?

FEB. 2019: Study Finds Squid Protein Could Be an Eco-Friendly Alternative to Plastics!

Plastic is polluting oceans worldwide by harming marine life and underwater habitats, but scientists are proposing another sustainable solution to the issue.

Penn State University scientists say the proteins used to develop **squid ring teeth** (SRT), a biopolymer material that's located in squid tentacles and enables them to grasp their food, could be engineered into an eco-friendly substitute for microplastics.

The team suggested that different types of bacteria could be used to make industrial batches of squid ring teeth SRT proteins, so future products that are typically made with plastics, will instead be made with this durable and eco-friendly material. These man-made SRT proteins will be based on the same ones found in squids, so the creatures won't need to be used in the process. Even though this is only an experiment, SRT proteins might help curb microplastics pollution in the future, reducing the amount of plastic garbage that ends up in the world's oceans.

This training will include a brief introduction to coaching/facilitation skills and then walk the team through a process for working with a congregational discipleship/ leadership team.

A one-day workshop designed to provide a common language for talking about discipleship in the Wesleyan traditions and the building of a pathway for providing appropriate relational and educational support of disciples along the pathway supported by clear expectations and accountability. Participants are encouraged to purchase a copy of the book Membership to Discipleship or Shift 2.0. Following a six-month pilot demonstrating the effectiveness of this training, the District will move into a Shift Leadership Network with a selected number of churches (based on coaching support available).
