From the Pastor's Pen

Virginia's United Methodist churches are moving towards gathering in person again. Bishop Sharma Lewis's team has recruited Pioneer Churches, which held their first inperson services on May 24. They are adhering to a protocol that prescribes among others: Twenty-five person limit, physical distancing, masks, no congregational singing, no handshakes or hugs, electronic bulletins, and drop-off offerings. As they report their findings, the next phase will include churches with fifty or less average attendance. This is where I hope Central will begin having people in the church for worship, since each of ours services averaged around thirty persons. Even then, I believe that broadcasting services online will continue.

We do not ignore scientific findings, but we are not used to so many restraints on worship. What is the spiritual attitude that we should adopt at this time, especially when it comes to the life of the church? As a rule, the Bible teaches us to accept authority, but ultimately we are to obey Jesus Christ. So surely that is the way to go. The laws of Christ however does demand much more from us than the laws of any human authorities.

During the New Testament time, some Christians felt free to eat whatever meat available at the market, while others were reticent, fearing that some had been used in food sacrifices to idols. The truth was that "nothing goes in can defile a person," as Jesus said (Mark 7:15), but in 1 Cor. 8 Paul was willing to cede that freedom for love's sake! "For you were called to freedom ... but through love become slaves to one another." (Gal. 5:13) That is a high calling indeed.

When we do resume in-person services, for love's sake—for the sake of Christ—I ask that we wear masks and follow other guidelines. I say little of the reports that the coronavirus is here to stay until effective vaccine or treatment is developed. Meanwhile, God knows the future, and we will continue living in him.

I think that so many in our community are to be commended for the sacrifices they have made, including the students. They missed out on classes, proms and graduations. But hopefully they will be wiser and stronger as a result. Life is unpredictable, and there but for the grace of God go we.

God's peace be with you all.




Staff-Parish Relations Committee

Brandon Robert Fry


Brandon's parents are Mark and Kendall Fry and he is the grandson of Marcia Fry. He will graduate from Grafton High school in York County.


