Most of us at some time or another have had an unexpected situation arise where a helping hand would have been a blessing. Usually we can call on family or friends, but they may not be readily available or are too far away for immediate assistance. That's where a new program that the United Methodist Men will be trying out to assist our church family (members and frequent attendees) comes in, if needed.

Here's how it works. You call any one of the three **HOTLINE** UMM members listed below and they will try to find a UMM volunteer available to assist you. This will not substitute for when a qualified, licensed professional is needed to deal with the problem, but in such cases we might be able to help with a possible stopgap measure until a qualified person gets there to resolve the issue. Here are just a few examples of how we might be able to help:

-You have an important appointment in Gloucester and you discover that your car won't start or you have a flat tire and need a ride.

-You are temporarily home bound and need someone to send and/or pick up your mail, groceries, or pharmacy.

-You have a tree limb down across your driveway or snow piled up and cannot get out

-You need someone to shovel or four wheel drive a path for your car to use.

-Your well pump is broken or you have a pipe leaking and you need containers of water or assistance until a plumber can get there to resolve the problem.

-Your heat pump or furnace is not working and it's not due to be repaired until tomorrow and it's going to be 15 degrees tonight - need someplace warm to spend the night.

From the Pastor's Pen

In June of 1999, fresh out of seminary and in the middle of a crisis of calling, I drove for three hours to Indianapolis to hear Billy Graham. At the packed RCA Dome the evangelist delivered a powerful message on the first evening. Somewhat unexpectedly from the "Just As I Am" evangelist, it was a clear call for obedience to Jesus Christ. I remember seeing the next morning a paper on a hotel breakfast table, with the front page showing Graham's picture and a headline, "Graham Extends God's Invitation." It was as if God was saying, "Yes, you heard from me yesterday."

The following night Graham took the pulpit only after several guests--Jeff Gordon, in particular, as I recall--gave lengthy speeches. Graham quipped, "Before coming up here I was watching the monitor with one eye and cutting my sermon with the other." That night his message did not seem to have power. He appeared to stumble through his sermon at times. He sat quietly during most of the altar call and finally surprised people by wrapping it up early. There were people still coming down! It occurred to me then that it had not been all glory days even for Billy Graham. He had long persevered in his obedience through elations and disappointments.

My two days in Indianapolis proved pivotal two months later, when I had an experience of spiritual reawakening. Mr. Graham will never know it, but I will always be grateful for his obedience.

We may not "hit it out of the park" every time as we serve God together. But if we are obedient, God has a way of bringing about his will. Nearly twenty years later, I still think of that time when I heard Billy Graham preach on Christ.
