#### Paige Family Update in Paraguay

Prayers Answered

And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. Ephesians 6:18 NIV

In our last newsletter we had asked for prayer for a solution to our car problem. Our poor Suzuki was left without an engine after serving us faithfully for 11 years. We were without transportation for 2 months and were anticipating not having money from the sale of our vehicle to put toward a car in Spain.

Then, in the month of December doors were opened for abundant provision:

In late November a Paraguayan friend told us that God had put it on her and her husband's hearts to make a sacrifice for us. On December 5th, they handed us the keys to their car with a legal document to use until we leave Paraguay in June!

On December 17th we were surprised to find a large donation from an unknown donor in our vehicle fund at TMS Global – Large enough to buy a car in Spain!

Later in December some friends even told us that we can borrow one of their cars when we come back to the States in June!

Provision for vehicles in Paraguay, the U.S., and Spain - ALL within 1 month! In January we were also able to sell our Suzuki without an engine.

Thank You to all those who made this possible through your prayers and giving.

**Donald's Graduation** 

On November 29th, Donald graduated from CFA's 2-year ministerial training program. He



persevered and finished despite a language barrier and a lack of transportation. He even rode his bicycle in the rain!

The completion of this training helped fulfill part of the purpose for why God called us back to Paraguay. We are so proud of him!

On February 22nd, Donald will begin a practical theology course to continue his pastoral training.

#### A Blessing to Serve

On Christmas Eve we joined our local church in serving over 300 children and their families a Christmas dinner. Cora and Carol played worship music and Cora stayed to help serve. Carol then joined Donald at the national hospital to give out pan dulce (sweet bread) and pray with patients.

On Three Kings Day (January 6th) we ministered again at another hospital. We gave out toys, diapers, and more prayer. Carol and a small group also played for the patients.



#### Asados and Fun

Over the long summer break (December and January) we had the opportunity for some much needed family time. We took time to rest, visit with friends, get dressed up for a quinceañera, and ate a lot of delicious asado (Paraguayan barbeque).

The heat, asado, and fireworks have been a part of our Christmas tradition for the past 12 years. We will miss it when we are gone!

#### **Please Pray**

School has been back in session for 2 weeks, but our students and staff have been affected by both dengue fever and influenza B. We ended up having to suspend classes on Friday for deep cleaning and prevention.

The Paraguayan Ministry of Health has reported that the confirmed cases of dengue fever are at a historic high (2,653 as of January 31st). Dengue is a mosquito-borne virus that causes high fever and acute pain behind the eyes and joints. The only treatment is Tylenol and rest.



Daniel missed a week of school with dengue symptoms but is fortunately on the mend.

Donald began a fever yesterday and is not feeling well today. Please pray!

As we continue to serve well in Paraguay, we are busy preparing for our move to Spain. We will be leaving Paraguay in June and our goal is to be in Madrid by August of 2020.
