From the Pastor: Sacred Rhythms

Have you ever played with or against a professional athlete? I once played golf with someone who was hoping to make it onto the pro tour. He hit the ball so much farther and closer to the pin that I almost thought of giving up the sport. Generally speaking the gap between professional athletes and even talented amateurs is enormous. Why? It is because the pros spend so much more time on training and practice. They discipline themselves in diet and exercise to be in peak condition. Over time it is bound to make a difference.

In the similar way, practices in spiritual life make a difference. For example, if we regularly make time to be alone and to pray, we will reap its reward. If we are constantly busy but rarely read the scripture, seldom pray, or do not make a habit of helping those in need; if giving and gratitude are only occasional accidents instead of intentional patterns; if we do not learn to take care of our body through healthy diet, rest, and activities, then our spiritual life will remain decidedly amateurish.

Methodists in the beginning were all about disciplined routines. They recognized that these practices did not have power in and of themselves; after all, nothing we do can take the place of the Holy Spirit. But it is because we believe in the Holy Spirit that we want to make room for him—for example, through a quiet time or prayer—in order to listen, to worship, and to follow. As the scripture says:

"Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh, but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit. So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will

reap at harvest time, if we do not give up." (Gal. 6:7-9, NRSV)

For this year's Lent I recommend Ruth Haley Barton's book, "Sacred Rhythms: Arranging our lives for spiritual transformation." She introduces in detail several practices that help us become more receptive to God's grace. Beginning with Tuesday, Mar. 14, we will have a weekly discussion group on the book on Tuesday evenings for those interested (Daylight Saving Time starts on Mar. 12th!).

It is one thing to sense God's presence at a revival, such as one that reportedly swept through Asbury University recently. But what we need in the long run is to live in the divine presence through faith in Jesus, who said, "I am with you always." It takes faith, and it is cultivated through spiritual disciplines. Our corporate worship on Sunday is one such "means of grace," as we call them.

I hope you will make this worthy investment this spring. Its rewards are eternal.

February is the month when we think of hearts – hearts for our health, hearts for our valentines. But I want to let you know about a Virginia Conference United Methodist organization called Heart Havens. It is a non-profit 501© 3 organization that provides a home and 24-hour support for adults with developmental disabilities.

A simple question, "Where will my child live when I die?" led the Virginia Conference Commission on Ministry to Persons with Handicapping Conditions to begin researching the possibility of residential services for adults with developmental disabilities. The first Heart Haven home was opened in Virginia Beach in 1999. There are several now around the state. I encourage you to seek out more information on this worthwhile endeavor by the Virginia Conference. 

My Preparation for Easter

Lent remembers Christ's sacrifices while looking forward to his resurrection. I make the following commitments to discipline and growth during this period:

(Check the ones you desire or feel prompted to do; circle the ones you then decide to do.)

Inward and Personal Disciplines
Spend time in solitude and prayer each day. Attend a Bible Study Class
Read through either the Gospel of Luke or the Gospel of John Begin to keep a journal of prayer concerns, questions, reading.
Focus on thanksgiving, rather than on asking, in prayer.
Find a way to go to bed earlier or sleep in so I get enough rest. Make a list of people with whom I need to be reconciled. Pray for them and let Jesus guide me in
my thinking and feeling toward them.
Go to Holy Week services as an act of love and waiting with Jesus.
Take one hour to inventory my priorities and plan how I will reorder them.
Give up a grudge or a rehearsal of a past event. Forgive someone who has hurt me.
Join a Sunday School Class
Other promptings:
Outward and Social Disciplines
Take on some loving task:
Plan to visit a "shut-in" neighbor or church member weekly.
Write a letter of affirmation once a week to a person who has touched my life.
Listen and respond to Christ's call to a ministry of service: Go to coffee or dinner with someone I want to know better.
Begin to recycle waste from my home and workplace.
Give blood.
Say "NO" to something that is a waste of money and time.
Pray to God to help me resist racial prejudice and to give me courage in opposing it.
Rebuke the spirit of criticism and my own tongue out of control.
Reach out to someone outside of my usual circles, city, or country Other outward and social promptings:

CUMW held our monthly meeting on February 13th in the Fellowship Hall to discuss upcoming events of the year.

Our project for February was to mail Valentine's Day Cards to several members of the congregation, near and far, to let them know that we are thinking of them and that they are in our hearts.

On March 12th we will be having our annual Candle Burning Service. Candle Burning is a channel of Mission Giving offered as a means of supporting mission programs around the world. We are lifting up the children of the

church by giving one minute of candle burning in their honor. We offer you the opportunity to honor or memorialize someone at this service. A listing of the candle burning gifts will be presented and the candle will burn during the service in the amount of time for which donations have been given. The cost is 60 Cents per second. (i.e., 1 minute = \$36.00). The forms have been distributed in the weekly bulletins with the instructions and the deadline is Sunday, March 6th. In addition to our Candle Burning Service, we will be assisting Pastor John with the service, serving as greeters, ushers, liturgist, and reading of the scriptures.

We voted to send \$100 to UMCOR with the designation of sending aid to the victims of the devastating earthquake in Syria and Turkey.

We will continue our monthly \$50 donation to the organizations that are chosen by the Mission and Evangelism Team.

As a reminder, we continue to collect Non-Food items for HAM in a bin in the Fellowship Hall There is also a need at HAM for canned vegetables and canned fruits as well as soup, cereal, pasta, and pasta sauce. These food items can be left in the vestibule between the sanctuary and the fellowship hall.
