#### From the Pastor's Pen

If Not Religious, What Am I?

"... the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord ..." (Rom. 1:3-4)

We read in Romans 1 that Jesus was known in two ways. "According to the flesh," he was a descendent of King David, as the Messiah should be, an important Jewish designation. But "according to the Spirit," he was "Son of God with power" who defeated powers of sin and death. The former was valuable, but the latter was much greater.

Paul himself was known in two ways. In his former life, he was a religious Jew according to its strictest sect, a Pharisee. As such he had his privileges and honors. In his new life, however, he was a minister to the non-Jewish

people. He was "a servant of Jesus."

What designations do you have "according to the flesh," or according to the human tradition? They would be the kind of things you will read in an obituary: Your family background, your job titles and work history, even the positions you held at the church. For me, I am a United Methodist minister, a Korean-American, a graduate of Emory University, eldest son, to name but a few.

Next, however, who are you "according to the Spirit," or how the Spirit is at work in your life? That may be where our true identify lies. It is who we are, for example, when we reach out to one another in love. One catechism called "Belonging to God" begins with this question and answer: Q – "Who are you?" A – "I am a child of God."

Our designations according to the human perspective may be valuable. I pray, however, that we will live into our new identify in the Spirit, both as individuals and as church. May God's grace lead us!

#### **Creation Care**

What's new with Central's Creation Care Team?

Researched problems at the Mathews
 Recycle Center: Often trucks were totally
 filled and customers had to go home and
 come back.



VPPSA contact, Tracy, told us: "Each time VPPSA pulled a container from the site, it costs Mathews County a pull fee."

Attendants are supposed to shake down the material to pack it the tightest possible.

**Solution:** If you arrive on site and find the containers are too full, the attendant should be able to do one of the following:

- a) set your recycling to the side and put it in the recycling containers for you after they have shaken down the material,
- b) keep it neatly there until the empty trucks/containers arrive.

Tracy promised to contact the supervisor and make sure this is handled properly. She will also make sure that they are scheduling the trucks to come often enough.

2. Thomas Hunter Middle School Recycle Presentations. Science teacher, Jerry Ligon, has retired. He had requested our recycle classes for several years. Our goal was to find out what the school would like for this year. We met with the 6th grade social studies teacher, Leslie Hudgins, and the

Science teacher, Christine Wheeler, and gave them details of our class. It was determined that Central's Recycle Program met the criteria of 10 of the SOL requirements.

Because of this we were asked to give our Recycle class to 90 students in January.



Challenge: they want it held at the school in one of the auditoriums.

Details will be worked on in the next two months.

3. What does China's Green Wall mean for U.S.? Last year China decided it had enough of being the world's trash dump. China was the biggest consumer of exported American mixed paper bales. Because of their new enforcement of strict contamination standards (less than.05% contamination) mixed paper from America has no market in China. The contamination is from food soiled paper items, broken glass, plastic bags, items not accepted for recycling.

Plastic is also being rejected in China. This may result in many more items being sent straight to our landfills. U.S. should start investing in new technologies that can better sort and process recyable waste. We should be building a market for these materials so that it is economically unwise to send them to a landfill. The Wall Street Journal reports that up to 20% of the scrap material the U.S. was shipping to China was contaminated with food or liquid. We must train consumers on recycling guidelines. That's where Creation Care can help. Limiting the use of plastic will also help.

4. Additional youth books were checked and repaired for Mathews' youth at our September meeting. We have now processed 661 books. Dee Bane collected this latest group to give to Three Rivers Healthy Families coordinators.


