Ten Years of Creation Care

Central United Methodist's 10 year Creation Care Program

Years ago, the Virginia Conference officially designated the Caretakers of God's Creation as a permanent Ministry. Central Church's goal was to create an informative presentation that would let our youth and adults know what we could do in Mathews County to help the county save money and help our planet.

Our presentation showed young people recycling different items. We set up the room with tables on one side filled with "trash." and tables on the other side waiting for recycled materials. After we told the class about an item that was in the trash by mistake, like cardboard, we would have races against the clock to transform the trash into valuable recycled material. At the end, everyone won a prize!

To make sure we had the real facts, we connected with The Virginia Peninsulas Public Service Authority (VPPSA) to find exactly what happened to Mathews' recycle materials. We presented first to the Youth of Central and then many other groups: UMW, the Boys & Girls Club, Kings Daughters, Three Rivers Healthy Families, to name just a few. The public schools heard of our program and soon Jerry Ligon, 7th grade Science teacher, was bringing classes to Central to learn about recycling. Throughout the years, we continued to update our information from VPPSA. As our program grew in popularity, Mathews public schools asked us to present to their students in their auditorium. Adult groups like PATH also asked us to come and present to more than 50 members. Other churches invited us to come and present our program to their youth.







It has now been 10 years since our first presentation. We see that some of our youth who participated are now graduating from high school or have already gone off to college.

We hope that we have instilled the ideas that taking care of God's planet is a privilege and a ministry each of us can do.
