Judy's Devotional

Christmas is coming! And December first is the first day of Advent. Advent is the first season in the liturgical year. Advent comes from an old Latin word, Adventus, meaning coming or arrival.

It was chosen to represent the time when Christ was not known to us. With His birth, the beginning of our faith was founded.



Scholars believe that during the fourth and fifth centuries in Spain and Gaul, Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany, the celebration of God's incarnation represented by the visit of Magi to the Baby Jesus.

Advent is a two-fold celebration: we not only celebrate the birth of Jesus but we look forward to His return—His "Parousia" —a Greek word that means when Christ returns again.

The primary liturgical color for Advent is purple, which symbolizes Christ's sovereignty, penance, sacrifice, and preparation.

Our celebration of Advent consists of an Advent wreath and five candles with four candles being lit each Sunday and the fifth Candle—the Christ candle being lit at the closet Sunday to Christmas Day. There are three purple candles and one pink candle. One is for hope, one for preparation, one for joy and one representing love.

Advent is a time of great anticipation, leading up to the birthday of Jesus, our "Messiah". Messiah comes from a Hebrew name meaning, "Anointed". The messiah was supposed to be a king and He was to deliver the Jews from the domination of the Romans.

For us, Jesus was born to save from sin, all who would believe in Him and follow His teachings. He was a gift from His heavenly Father: John 3:16. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him, would not perish, but have everlasting life."

No greater gift as ever been given than this!

I'm saddened by the way the birth of Jesus is being pushed away in today's world. May we, as Christians, never forget what God has done for us by giving His Son to save all of us from our sins. There is no greater love than this! Jesus' sacrifice was no "walk in the park". Did any of you see Mel Gibson's movie, The Passion of Christ? I did and it had a profound effect on me. We have no idea of the great suffering He endured on our behalf. May we always celebrate the "true" meaning of Christmas: "Jesus is the reason for the season!"
