Bushel Full of Lights

"Give and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." (Luke 6:38)

The Central UMW used this passage for their cookbook title a few years ago. It would be easy, after reading this, to focus on what we would get out of giving, but it misses the whole point of this quotation. Jesus preceded his statement with, "Love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked," (v. 35)." Jesus is asking us to love like our Father in heaven, who loves us in spite of our failings."

Solar-Powered Disaster Response

We have all seen or heard of the devastating impact of the growing climate crisis has on the people around the world including in the USA. Leaders of United Methodist Global Ministries have joined a coalition of United Methodist agencies pledging to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions across the organizations' ministries, facilities, operations and investments by 2050.

United Methodist Global Ministries have already taken many steps toward the net zero goal in <u>individual churches</u> and in many other <u>joint projects</u>. Below is just one example:



Solar-Powered Disaster Response Trailer Visits Charlotte


As climate change exacerbates more frequent and extreme heat waves, hurricanes, and other climate disasters, fossil fuels are still the go-to source of backup power during emergencies. Solar microgrid trailers, which provide clean power, are easily towed to where they are needed most during an emergency—to power cell phones, Wi-Fi, refrigeration, lighting, medical devices and other critical services.

In April of 2024, at the Charlotte North Carolina Convention Center, the public was invited to visit a <u>state-of-the-art solar-powered disaster response trailer</u> that combines environmental sustainability with the disaster ministry of The United Methodist Church.

In times of disaster, gaining access to a source of power is one of the most essential yet challenging parts of response and recovery. This trailer is a transportable eco-friendly energy source that provides vital emergency power without the environmental damage caused by traditional fossil fuels. The solar microgrid trailer is a tangible example of The United Methodist Church's commitment to CREATION CARE and environmental stewardship.
